

## **BDAS & BOWRAL ART GALLERY COVID SAFE RULES FOR 2022**

Under the current NSW Government guidelines, in order to protect the well-being of staff, members, volunteers and visitors, the Bowral & District Art Society and Bowral Art Gallery will require all visitors to the premises :

1. to wear a face mask indoors
2. to check-in using the QR Code or provide their contact details when they enter these premises.
3. to be fully vaccinated and to show evidence that this is the case. This includes staff, tutors, students, models, contractors and casual visitors.

### **Other protocols to continue:**

- Social distancing rules remains at 1 person per 2sq.metre.
- Anyone feeling unwell should not attend class.
- Hand sanitizer must be used by all people coming and going. Tutors, please do the same with door handles, taps etc for each session.
- Tutors or students may bring morning, afternoon tea, but everyone coming to the workshops must provide their own cups, drink bottles, cutlery etc.
- It is preferable that tea & lunch breaks be taken outdoors
- We ask that no food items are left in the fridge or the studio.
- We ask all students to provide their own table covers, water containers, palettes and to please take them home at the end of each class.
- Spray disinfectant will be provided and we ask that chairs, easels etc be cleaned at the end of each session.
- Please assist air movement by keeping doors open and ceiling fans on low

## BDAS / BOWRAL ART GALLERY COVID SAFE RULES for 2022

The following is an extract from “Services NSW COVID Safe Rules” 7/1/2022:

### MASKS

All people over the age of 12 must wear a face mask indoors.

### QR SAFE CHECK-IN

Occupiers of premises are required to continue to take reasonable steps to ensure people can check-in or provide their contact details when they enter these premises.

### VACCINATION EVIDENCE

“Most premises in NSW are now open to everyone, regardless of whether you are fully vaccinated or not.

You no longer need to show evidence that you are fully vaccinated at most premises”

### Occupiers of premises

“Some premises may choose to require people to be fully vaccinated or to wear a mask as a condition of entry.

**It is a matter for the occupier of each premises to exercise judgement on what is appropriate for the premises and the well-being of the staff and customers.**

**If you want to enter premises where an occupier has chosen to require you to be fully vaccinated, the occupier may ask to see your vaccination evidence. You do not have to show the occupier your vaccination evidence, but if you do not, the occupier may not let you in.”**
